Later this year, Perth Art Gallery will also become home to the **Fergusson Collection.**



The museum will be in the Edwardian building - an historic venue itself that has been transformed by awardwinning architects Mecanoo.


The Stone of Destiny


"The Stone of Destiny is an ancient symbol of Scotland. A stone that helped to make kings and queens, it was used in the inauguration of Scottish monarchs at Scone, just upriver from Perth. The Stone's story stretches back through the ages and is still used to crown kings and queens of the United Kingdom today, including the coronation of King Charles III in 2023."

FERGUSSON GALLERY

J D Fergusson was one of the most important and influential artists in Britain in the first half of the 20th century. Born in Edinburgh, with ancestral links to Perthshire, he spent much of his career in France and is now most associated with the Scottish Colourist group. The Fergusson Gallery holds his vast collection of artwork and associated archives, along with the archive of his lifelong companion, the pioneer of modern dance, Margaret Morris.
